

SEPTEMBER WORK DAYS PAY BIG DIVIDENDS

The September work weekend was held in Rockhill on 9/9 and 9/10. We had 21 volunteers on Saturday and 14 on Sunday, plus three working in Robertsdale. The September work week was held in Rockhill from Monday 9/18 to Friday 9/22. We had 10 volunteers on Monday, 17 on Tuesday plus one more in Robertsdale, 12 on Wednesday, 17 on Thursday, and 11 on Friday. The seven total work days and our dedicated volunteers allowed for significant progress to be made this month.

The track crew installed 48 more ties south of the Oddfellows Cemetery Road grade crossing, and replaced ties on the main line near the Blacklog Creek Bridge.

New wooden support platforms were constructed for the two locomotive water spouts, and new lower door frames, doors, and transom windows were completed for the coal dock.

Combine 14 had new wooden platform steps cut, trial assembled, and primed, and one platform gate fitted. Interior details in the passenger compartment were reinstalled including clerestory vent covers and the drinking water container. End doors and siding received final paint.

New exterior doors and trim were installed and painted in the Storehouse lean-to, completing the exterior of the Storehouse project. Lean-to interior details including the manager's counter, paper and twine roll holders, and doors were installed. Finally, all remaining hardware was removed from the storage container and returned to the Storehouse and its lean-to. Check out the cover photo to see the progress made on the Storehouse lean-to.

The work week again included volunteer social activities including lunch each day at the RTM pavilion, a cookout Wednesday evening followed by vintage EBT movies from the Archives, and a group dinner at a local restaurant on Thursday.

EBT Three Springs Depot

The Three Springs Depot was built in 1877. During the life of the depot, it went through a number of changes. Pictorial records show in the early years it had a smokejack on the roof and the loading dock was only 2 feet high. The smokejack was at some point replaced with a chimney. Later, the loading dock was raised to about 3 feet high and the train order board was added on the roof.



This kit includes all of the parts to build the station at any stage of its life, or any combination the builder chooses. There is also a choice of skirting for around the loading dock. This HO scale model has a foundation footprint of $6\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{3}{4}$ inches. It is laser-cut basswood and plywood with resin detail parts. This model would make a great addition to your EBT model railroad!

A BUSY SEPTEMBER IN ROBERTSDALE

Hold your horses, we'll get to the reunion soon enough.

First, I want to tell you a little about what's been happening in September.

We've had 91 visitors (and still one September weekend to go) so far this month. I hope that number impresses you; it should!

On 9/9 Andy Van Scyoc, Frank R. Dziama, and Rick Rourke came up and took almost all the rust and dirt off of one of the hopper cars in Robertsdale. See the pictures, the little bit of it that did not stick to them, they collected in a bucket. That was a long, hot day for them, so tell 'em thanks when you see them.



On 9/16 Frank Benenati came to replace the broken valve for the exterior hose hookup. This has been broken for quite some time, with the result that if we needed any water pressure at all (it had broken when in a partly open position) we had to connect a hose inside and run it through the museum to a door or window. Not ideal. Among other things, this caused us to not bother trying to clean the cleanable air filter for the HVAC system. Also, not ideal. Frank's dad was a plumber and trained him well. I think he was a little disappointed when he figured out that he didn't have to deal with 100+ year old pipes, "Where's the challenge?" he thought. Done, looking great, functioning great, and now you'll breathe well-filtered air when at the museum.

On 9/19 Frank R. Dziama and Larry Fuchs came up and painted that hopper. Bingo, it looks ready to roll. It won't, it's got lots of problems and that's why it's where it is, but it looks great. At least 1,000% better than the notyet-done cars next to it.

2024 – LOOKING FORWARD

Your generous support of the 2023 FEBT fundraising campaign, combined with the dedication of our FEBT volunteers, has enabled us to make great progress to preserve, restore, and interpret the East Broad Top. This year we've installed over 1.100 ties, and funded 1.500 more. In Rockhill we've rebuilt the Storehouse lean-to, rebuilt the Car Shop south end, and replaced large sections of the Boiler Shop and Locomotive Shop roofs. Restoration of Combine 14 and Boxcar 174 are both nearing completion. New railbikes have been delivered, and will soon be available for rides south from our FEBT Museum in Robertsdale, and the new FEBT Library has opened in the Old Post Office building. The Saltillo Station site survey and preliminary architectural drawings were completed. The EBT Archives & Special Collections Program has added over 1,100 items to the public site, and completed digitizing and indexing all of the Baldwin drawings relating to locomotives No. 14 and No. 15.

These efforts complement the amazing progress made by the EBT Foundation this year. Steam returned with the completion of engine No. 16. New passenger cars were put in service. Colgate Grove was rebuilt. The right-of-way has been cleared and graded from the PA Route 475 crossing south to Jordan Summit, and clearing of the ROW has been done to Southern Huntingdon High School, just north of the Pogue bridge.

These combined efforts bring us to an exciting place as we look forward to 2024. With the tourist trackage and the Rockhill complex in the best condition in decades, we can begin to shift focus to resurrecting track and facilities that have been dormant or lost for decades. And we have unprecedented momentum from our 2023 fundraising. Stay tuned for the announcement of our

TRACK REPORT: BUILDING (REBUILDING) & MAINTAINING

Two major themes emerge from this month's report where the track gang is concerned: Building (rebuilding) and maintaining.

We continued the railroad's march southward, if only a little bit, in late August and September. The switch located just north of the IOOF Cemetery Road crossing (which is the southernmost switch in the Rockhill yard) was completely redone. Rail was pulled off, the surface was graded, new ties were laid down, and the whole thing was put back together again. After all that was done, the track surface was leveled and tamped. As part of this work, the siding leading to Track 3 from the switch (the switch is in Track 2, the main track) had some initial work done to redo it, as well.

The crossing itself was also redone. The same process applies here, too: rail was pulled out, the surface was graded, new ties were laid out, and the whole thing was put back together.







After that, forty-eight ties were installed in the main south of the crossing during the September Work Weekend on September 9th. Those ties were spiked up on Monday of the September Work Week. Once stone is applied to this area, and the track is leveled and tamped, over 200 feet (reaching a point 1,100 or 1,200 feet south of the coal tipple) of newly-rebuilt track will be added to the serviceable track that the railroad can use.

Maintaining

Track 2 (the main) gets a lot of use these days, and especially so when the railroad is operating five days a week. To support that activity, the track crew installed thirty-seven ties on the north (27 ties) and the south side (10 ties) of the Blacklog Creek bridge (located north of the station) during the Work Week. Work to strengthen the track structure will continue in the days ahead.

Challenges (to be overcome)

We in the track department like to think that we have more fun than anyone at the railroad. (Please, let us live with our illusions...we know others also have lots of fun doing good things for the railroad's future and wellbeing.) How about devoting some time to our work?

Exchequer: (Money) Thanks to your generosity, FEBT's fundraising has been spectacularly successful. Having the funds to buy needed items, and to make grants to the railroad, speeds up the process of rebuilding and advancing the railroad's welfare. We can't say "thank you" enough.

<u>From the "Credit Where Credit is Due" Department</u> We are blessed to have personnel who are talented, hardworking individuals. Some of them also have wonderful senses of humor (always a delight!).

Giving credit where credit is due, then, the following assisted in midweek sessions and at the September Work To do its work, the track gang needs the following:

Stuff: We need ties, spikes, tie plates, bolts, and other hardware. We now have on hand the bolts, spikes and tie plates that will be used for redoing the track south of the PA 475 crossing. These supplies were purchased with funds provided by a recent grant by FEBT (thanks to your generosity, which makes this progress possible!). What we have very little of currently is ties. Neither the railroad's principal supplier, nor its secondary supplier, have relay ties at the moment. So, a third option is being pursued.

People: We are blessed to have a steady number of active volunteers (see the list below). But, the truth is, the number of those coming to lend their help is dropping off. (This trend is also visible in the other areas of FEBT's current efforts to support the railroad.)

General rules

Any FEBT member who is a Reunion registrant may enter the model and photo contests. No model or photo that has ever won an award in a previous FEBT contest may be entered.

Photographs

- Must feature the EBT or related restoration activities.
- All photos must be mounted on/in a mat board no larger than 11 by 14 inches; the photo may be any size but not exceed the size of the mat.
- New! Panoramic and wide-format photos. The max size for mat board is 30 x 14 inches.
- No picture frames or glass/Plexiglas covers may be used.
- No more than two photos may be submitted by a single entrant in each category.
- Only the photographer can enter a photo.
- Color and black-and-white photos must be entered in one of these categories:
 - <u>Classic Original:</u> photos with minimal alterations beyond cropping.
 - <u>Artist's Choice</u>: entries may have <u>any</u> manipulations and enhancements done to achieve the desired end.
- The *Timber Transfer* editor may present an Editor's Choice Award.

Models

- All models must be based on subjects directly related to the EBT.
- No limit to the number of models entered by each entrant.
- There must be at least two models entered in a category for a contest to be declared. (No award will be given in any category in which a contest is not declared.)
- Categories may be combined to ensure a contest.
- Supporting documentation may be displayed with any entry, as long as the entrant's name does not appear on any of the documentation.
- The model contest categories are as follows:
 - o Locomotives Any self-propelled equipment except maintenance-of-way speeders;
 - Rolling Stock Any revenue freight or passenger equipment; any nonrevenue equipment primarily intended for track or lineside maintenance.
 - Structures and Module/Dioramas Any building or other structure, either railroad-related or lineside; and any structure or structures that are mounted on a base which depicts a scene, with or without track.
 - "What If" Any model depicting a facet of the EBT had history played out differently (had the EBT standard gauged, carried on past 1956, etc.)

Special restoration program model contest

This award recognizes the model that best represents a project undertaken by our restoration volunteers. The award consists of a special plaque created by our Rockhill Furnace restoration crew. This special award will be based on the popular vote of current restoration volunteers. – *Andy Van Scyoc*
